

## **Assessment principles**

Individual applications for training posts in STP will be assessed against the following priority areas:

- Demonstration of meeting an educational imperative
- Demonstration of quality training including issues of supervision, infrastructure etc
- Innovation
- Short and long term workforce needs
  - Rural or regional settings
  - Generalist specialist training pathway
  - Chronic disease or Indigenous health

## **STP Governance**

Training post selection for 2011 STP training posts will be governed using the following principals agreed by the Enhanced Medical Education Advisory Committee as follows:

1. there will be an open application round
2. applications will be assessed separately by:
  - the relevant medical specialist college; and
  - the relevant State/Territory Government; and
  - the employer of registrar (if this is not a State/Territory health department).

Applications will be assessed against the priority areas by the assessor bodies listed above. They may choose to rank the priority areas differently. Assessments will be provided to the Commonwealth using a standardised form which will include a global assessment and rationale.

The Commonwealth will then collate assessments and apply a ranking system that considers the assessment of the above bodies as well as the EMEAC priority areas.

The administering body (College or other education/training provider) will then be provided with the successful posts to manage
