## TRAINING PROGRAM CODES

### GENERAL INFORMATION

#### Appointments are generally for 12 months.

Basic Specialist Training programmes are suitable for candidates who wish to enter specialist training under the appropriate College. These are:

- General Practice Training (for those who have enrolled with the college)
- Basic Physician Training
- Emergency Medicine Training
- Obstetrics and Gynaecology (DRANZCOG)

Candidates should be either prospective or enrolled trainees with an approved training provider.

Surgical RMO positions are suitable for trainees who are intending to register with the RACS (Royal Australasian College of Surgeons) and who are working towards entry into SET. These positions are comprised of rotations designed to meet mandatory requirements for SET entry. Please note: Hospitals only employ for a maximum of 2 years within Surgical RMO positions. If trainees are not accepted into SET after this time employment within Surgical RMO positions cannot continue.

General (Non-Specialist) Training Programme positions are general rotations suitable for trainees not yet committed to a specific specialist training programme, but who are seeking further hospital experience.

For the DRANZCOG and DRANZCOG Advanced, candidates must be in their **second** or subsequent post-graduate year in order to be accepted into training and meet the examination requirements.

**General Practice trainees are required to be accepted by the College before the appointment at the end of this process and evidence will be sought.**

Incomplete applications are difficult to process which may result in you not being short-listed so please check carefully to ensure that all the application requirements have been met.

## TRAINING PROGRAMMES AND CODES

### FLINDERS MEDICAL CENTRE [FMC]
